

All applications must have signature of a **Post Officer** and if they are a **Junior member a Birthdate.** The transmittals have the new address on it. They were revised this year, so please look it over and follow directions on filling out. This will save you and me time. For this year Back Dues will be \$10.00 for senior members. Next year they will be \$14.00. Please correct this on your transmittal form.

Unit Membership Chairman should check each application to make sure it is filled out completely including zip codes before processing into Department Headquarters. All incomplete applications will be sent back.

Memberships is coming in good now. Please allow time for yours' to be processed into National before contacting me on ID numbers for new members.

Rosters are <u>mailed</u> to each unit in August when the Directory comes out. This will be

your current roster. After that rosters will only be sent by emails. Membership for 2013 will be taken until July 31st. Then they will be considered back dues starting August 1st. Remember for 2014 **back dues will be \$14.00.** It will be listed on the 2014 transmittal forms.



Legislative


Hello Ladies,



It was great getting to work with all of the officers this year and meeting new people and becoming friends with everyone! I hope to continue friendships with everyone for a long time.



Children and Youth


Dear Ladies,



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

Section 1. Membership in the American Legion Auxiliary shall be limited to the mothers, wives daughters, sisters, granddaughters, great-granddaughters and grandmothers of members of The American Legion, and to the mothers, wives, daughter, sisters, granddaughters, great-granddaughters and grandmothers of all men and women who were in the Armed Forces of the United States during any of the following Periods: April 6, 1917 to November 11, 1918; December, 7, 1941 to December 31, 1946; June 25, 1950 to January 31, 1955; February 28, 1961 to May 7, 1975; August 24, 1982 to July 31, 1984; December 20, 1989 to January 31, 1990; August 2, 1990, to the date of cessation of hostilities as determined by the government of the United States; all dates inclusive, or who being citizens of the United States at the time of their entry therein, served on active duty in the Armed Forces of any of the governments associated with the United States during any of said periods, and died in line of duty or after honorable discharge; and to those women who of their own right ore eligible for membership in The American Legion.

Section 1. Membership in the American Legion Auxiliary shall be limited to the mothers, wives daughters, sisters, granddaughters, great-granddaughters and grandmothers of members of The American Legion, and to the mothers, wives, daughter, sisters, granddaughters, great-granddaughters, grandmothers (and step) of all mon and women who were in the Armed Forces of the United States during any of the following Periods: April 6, 1917 to November 11, 1918; December, 7, 1941 to December 31, 1946; June 25, 1950 to January 31, 1955; February 28, 1961 to May 7, 1975; August 24, 1982 to July 31, 1984; December 20, 1989 to January 31, 1990; August 2, 1990, to the date of cessation of hostilities as determined by the government of the United States; all dates inclusive, or who being citizens of the United States at the time of their entry therein, served on active duty in the Armed Forces of any of the governments associated with the United States during any of said beriods, and died in line of duty or after honorable discharge; an to those women who of their own right are eligible for membership in The American Legion.

Section 6. No person shall be eligible to hold two elected or appointed offices at the same time at Department or District level, those offices being Department President, Department First Vice President, Department Second Vice President, Department Secretary/Treasurer, Department Chaplain, Department Historian, District President, and District Vice President.

Section 7. Any elected District Officer may run for a Department Office. If elected as a Department Officer, she will have to resign her District office. She does not have to resign until elected in Department.
