



I'm sorry there was no time slot for news from the Chaplain's corner so I will share some things here. First remember to report any deceased members so they may be included in the memorial service at the summer convention in July. Remember the deadline for end of year reports is JUNE 1ST. I still need sentiments and prayers for the Department prayer book. You can mail those to me at PO Box 63 Reader, WV. 26167.

I was hoping to share more information with you about the "Missing in America Project" (MIAP) You can check out the website www.miap.us/wv If you visit the Legion website www.legion.org and type in the search box "Missing in American project," you will see the National executive board of the American Legion endorsed this program in a resolution in 2007. Since that time the MIAP has gained support from the SAL and ALR as well as other organizations. Our Auxiliary was not listed. The MIAP has been working around the US since 2007. The first interment for WV was in October 2013 The mission is to contact hospitals and funeral homes to locate abandon cremated remains, Identify them as veterans or the spouse of a veteran, run a next of kin search and if no family is found to claim them, then the MIAP makes arrangements to inter the cremated remains in local National cemeteries where the veteran died. It takes approximately 2-3 years to conduct the searches and ID process. It cost \$50.00 for each cremains to be given the burial they deserve (\$30.00 for State and \$20.000 for county) which is the fee to move a body. Everything else is done by volunteers. I am limited on space for spirit articles so Please take time to check out the website. There is direction on how to donate, and they have a calendar of scheduled escort missions and the funeral services for these men and women who have been forgotten and left behind.

Hello Ladies

I would like to remind units that the end –of- year reports are due by June 1st.

I will be giving additional certificates which I call the "Pink Ribbon Award" to units who include in the narrative, with at least one photo, something you have done to raise awareness of the Bonnie's Bus Mobile Mammography program. I also have special gifts for the best over- all reports. It can be as simple as making posters to display in your community. You can even host a Bonnie's Bus visit to your community. Check the website www.wvucancer.edu There you will find detailed information and a calendar of scheduled visits for 2014, how to donate, and more information about what this program's mission is all about. There is a video clip on youtube.com with the director doing an interview and an inside tour of the bus.

One hundred percent of all funds donated through President Debbie's special project goes directly to the Bonnie's Bus, nothing is used for overhead or salary. It is estimated that the cost of just one mammogram through this program costs roughly \$250.00 it is so low because the WVU Mary (Bab) Randolph Cancer Center does all the work, nothing has to be sent out for lab readings or digital processing. So for every \$250.00 we raise we have possibly helped to save one life. These are our friends, neighbors, mothers, grandmothers, sisters and daughters. They are also our husbands, fathers, brothers and sons. Breast cancer does not discriminate, men do get breast cancer. Although male mammograms can be performed on the BB it is recommended for more accuracy to do them in a stationary facility when possible. What better way to serve our veterans than to help them, and those they love, win the fight with breast cancer, by raising awareness and supporting this amazing community service, we can make a difference.

Children and Youth

April is Children & Youth Month and I hope each Unit planning a special project during the month. Please try to target military kids but know that all children & Youth can benefit from what your unit has to offer. Consider collecting books, movies and board games to be donated to local hospitals and children's home. Just remember to be sure they are age appropriate. It is not to early to consider distributing backpacks during the summer. Start collecting item needed now and distribute during July or August. Many units and the National organization have scholarships available for military children but a common complaint is "We don't know how to find them". I have included some tips for locating these kids. You will need to now because you can utilize the help of the schools in your area.

How to find Military Children for Scholarships

Many military families can use help from scholarships, but they may not know where to find or receive them. Numerous scholarships are available to students every year, including American Legion Auxiliary's. But, sometimes, making our organization more visible is the best way to ensure our scholarships get in to the hands of those who really need them.

**Contact Local Organizations or Schools

First, contact local high school guidance counselors, Boys and Girls Clubs, Big Brothers/Big Sisters or other youth-affiliated organizations and representatives in your area who may work directly with military children. Send them all available information about ALA's scholarship. Ask that they include the information with other similar items they may pass out to their students or ask that they post it somewhere in the school or organization.

- **Include information on how to reach the ALA Unit if they have questions
- **Follow up with the guidance counselor or organization to see if there has been any interest in the scholarships. If there has been, let the counselor know that the ALA Unit can be contacted if questions arise.
- **While you are checking back with the school counselor, ask if they hold a college fair; some schools do. Ask if, at the fair, scholarship packets will be distributed. If they will be, ask to have your local unit, department and national scholarship information added.




Education


