Mandatory Funds are Bonding, Department Scholarship, Girls State Project, Veterans 1st Fund, Poppy Order & 10% Poppy Proceeds. Make check payable to Department Treasurer, ALA. DUE into Department Headquarters by June 10th to be a Delegate for Department Convention, if attending, or July 31st to be a Unit in good standing.

Processing Membership:

Make sure your membership is into Department Headquarters by the **15th** to be counted for Targets.

Membership:

All applications must have signature of a **Post Officer** and if they are a **Junior member a Birthdate.** Unit Membership Chairman should check each application to make sure it is filled out <u>completely</u> including City, Post #, State and zip code if eligibility is under a Veteran living before processing into Department Headquarters. If a veteran is living they must hold membership in The American Legion.

<u>Update on Female Veterans Joining</u> <u>Auxiliary:</u>

If a female veteran wishes to join the Auxiliary under herself, she doesn't need to belong to the Legion, and the Unit Secretary may sign application, if eligibility falls under the same war era as The American Legion eligibility. But if members of her family wish to join the Auxiliary under her, she then must be a member of The American Legion and the Post Adj. needs to sign the application.

MAKE SURE THE POST OFFICER SIGNS APPLICATIONS.

<u>UNIT CONTACTS:</u> If you don't print Spirit off for the Unit President, then in order for her to receive the Spirit, your Unit need to pay \$16.00 for a year's subscription, starting with the August Issue.

I have some updates from our National Central Division Chairman that I need to share with you. The month of April was set for veteran's job fairs around the nation and the auxiliary was asked to participate any way we could. There were no job fairs listed for WV. If anyone knows of any veteran job fairs held in WV please be sure to report them so they may be included in the national updates.

Another matter was in defining community services and the aim to get the auxiliary back to our purpose in this program. There is a difference in the auxiliary's community services compared to the Legion's, the Sons of the Legion, and the Legion Riders. While they support anyone, any group, any organization or program, our auxiliary's focus is on the veterans and their families.

We've become a little over expansive over the years by reporting fundraisers or donations for other organizations such as Diabetes and Cancer Centers, Autism and other special needs -clinics, hospitals, relay for life groups, and a vast number of other groups or organizations. All of these are quite necessary and very valuable community assets. However they are "other organizations" and not focused on just serving veterans and their families. We, as auxiliary can still be supportive by raising awareness and directing our veterans and families. We can use our funds to help the veteran and the family if they need the services of such facilities. We can use designated funding to help them with travel and fuel costs so they can go, or aid with things like medications and medical equipment for their home. We can pitch in to help with utilities or rent, or babysitter costs for their children. Basically any direct assist to the veteran and family instead of a bulk donation for another organization to use for their purposes.

National knows and understands the need to reach out to everyone and that is what our Legion does and with them so do their SAL and ALR programs. They continue to serve the nation even after their enlistment has ended. However the auxiliary was organized to serve the veteran and his or her family so they can better serve. "....the aims and purposes of the American Legion."

Public Relations

Public and Media Relations:

The primary goal of any ALA public relations effort is to create positive publicity for the American Legion Auxiliary's programs and mission. Media relations refers to the connection between the ALA and the journalists, while public relations extend beyond the media to the general public. Keep in mind that not everything important to your unit will be important to the media or the public. News coverage is determined by value and relevance to the media's audience, and the person you contact at the newspaper or news station will ultimately decide what is newsworthy and will evaluate your story accordingly.

Social Media:

Traditional media outlets, such as TV, magazines, and newspapers, are like a one-way street. You can read a newspaper or watch a television newscast, but you do not have a lot of options for sharing your opinions on a topic. Social media, however, is a two-way street, allowing you to engage in dialogue with others. Communication through social media gives you power to share and connect using text, audio, video, and photos. The American Legion Auxiliary utilizes these new technologies to help us stay connected to members and to help members connect with one another. While there are many social media sites, Facebook, Twitter, Tumblr, Pinterest, Flickr, YouTube, and others –Facebook is the social media site that currently resonates best with Auxiliary members.

Facebook is the ideal social media site for unit members to interact with one another and with the community. The first step is to create a unit Facebook page. Use your unit's name as the title, and appoint someone in your unit to manage it. Post updates and photos of your activities, create events for your meetings, and make sure to keep your contact information and unit website up-to-date. All members of your unit on Facebook should "like" your page so they can share the information you post with friends. Your unit page can also "like" pages of groups that are important to you such as American Legion Auxiliary Department and National Headquarters, American Legion, news stations and civic organizations. Be sure the information post is appropriate for public audience beyond your membership. Never post personal comments remember public is public in social media.

Legislative

Finally it's starting to feel and look like spring has arrived. Flowers and trees are starting to bud and bloom. I just hope we truly get some spring weather before rolling into the summer heat. Seems like we have gotten to the point we just go from winter to summer and forget the spring and fall.

A few recent bills that need our attention, Bill H.R. 235 aims to speed up the certification, and licensing of military veterans as EMTs (emergency Medical Techs). Military Medics have the same if not more experience and training than civilians. There is no reason it should take military medics 8 or months to become certified as EMTS. The bill will shorten or eliminate the long process and put jobs in the hands of those returning home more quickly. This bill passed in the U.S. House of Representatives but needs approved by the U.S. Senate and signed by the President to become law.

March 27, 2014 there were 1,892 flags planted on the National Mall in Washington DC, each representing the number of veterans and service members estimated to have committed suicide so far in 2014. A new bill was recently introduced in the U.S. Senate. This bill aims to improve suicide prevention for veterans. The bill will extend combat eligibility from 5 to 15 years from date of discharge and calls for an increase in mental health professionals in the VA.

2. Both external auditor and ALA Foundation advised us to make planned gifts and to promote planned giving.


3. The national auditor gave our National Headquarters its highest rating. It was reported that all departments need to hear this point.

How to Get Involved with Operation: Military Kids (OMK)

Operation Military Kids is a program that was created in response to 9/11 and the Global War on Terrorism. The program was created by Army Child & Youth Services and State 4-H Military Liaisons to meet the needs of children whose parents were suddenly deployed. OMK has several different programs that individuals or units can get involved with. Each state has a coordinator ready and willing to work with you. I have included information about the West Virginia Operation below. Be sure to let Ms. Davis know you are with the American Legion Auxiliary.

What is the West Virginia Operation: Military Kids Program? West Virginia's OMK program is a collaborative effort to provide support to military children in our communities that have been impacted by deployment. They work to ensure that an effort is made to create a smooth transition through the deployment process by offering fun, social, and educational experiences to military children. Our Mission: West Virginia OMK supports deployed National Guard, Reserve, and Active Duty Soldiers' children living in communities across our state by:

- **Helping to create networks of people, organizations, and other resources to help support military children
- **Helping children better understand and cope with military life, family member deployment and reintegration, as well as the unique challenges facing their families
- **Offering a wide array of recreational, social, and educational programs for military youth living in civilian communities
- **Educate and increase community awareness of the impact of the deployment cycle on soldiers, families, kids, and the community as a whole

Major Components of WV OMK:

Speak Out for Military Kids (SOMK): SOMK is a youth-led, adult facilitated program that helps increase community awareness of the challenges faced by military youth and their families. The participants include both military and non-military youth who work together to develop presentations, public service announcements, videos, and other materials to share with communities across the state. Mobile Technology Lab (MTL): The MTL is used to facilitate and maintain connections between deployed service members and their children. The lab contains laptop computers, digital and video cameras, printer, scanner, and software to help children and youth send personal messages to their loved ones. The lab can be requested and used by any OMK partner.

Ready, Set, Go! Training (RSG): Trained facilitators deliver workshops designed to develop local support networks of youth workers, educators, counselors, and community service agencies. The training offers an insight into military culture and the deployment cycle and suggests way to understand the needs of and provide support to military kids and their families through community resources.






