Make check payable to Department Treasurer, ALA. **DUE into Department** Headquarters by June 10th to be a **Delegate for Department Convention, if** attending, or July 31st to be a Unit in good standing.

Processing Membership:

Make sure your membership is into Department Headquarters by the 15th to be counted for Targets.

Membership:

All applications must have signature of a Post Officer and if they are a Junior member a Birthdate. Unit Membership Chairman should check each application to make sure it is filled out completely including City, Post #, State and zip code if eligibility is under a Veteran living before processing into Department Headquarters. If a veteran is living they must hold membership in The American Legion.

Update on Female Veterans Joining Auxiliary:

If a female veteran wishes to join the Auxiliary under herself, she doesn't need to belong to the Legion, and the Unit Secretary may sign application, if eligibility falls under the same war era as The American Legion eligibility. But if members of her family wish to join the Auxiliary under her, she then must be a member of The American Legion and the Post Adj. needs to sign the application.

MAKE SURE THE POST OFFICER SIGNS APPLICATIONS.

UNIT CONTACTS: If you don't print Spirit off for the Unit President, then in order for her to receive the Spirit, your Unit need to pay \$16.00 for a year's subscription, starting with the August Issue.



BRIDGEPORT — The volunteers at the Louis A. Jornson VA Medical Center were treated ike a million bucks Friday at the Bridgeport Conference Center.

That is only fitting, as the volunteers' combined 60,002 hours of selfless service to patients translates into more than \$1 million, said Wesley Walls, the medical center's interim cheef of voluntary services.

galls, Wood, Tucker and Braxton counties." Walls

Walls was referring to the medical center's ford annual volunteer recognition ceremony.

Some 160 volunteers enjoyed a meal while listening to big hand music prorided by the Bridgeport ligh School Jazz Band.

Several volunteers were singled out for reaching milesiones in hours of serv-

Dortha Parsons, who has racked up the most hours at 22,500 was among them


22,500 was among them Parsons, who started volunteering in November 1977, said she serves as a receptionist for medical services. "I love my veterans," she said. "I had two brothers in the service — one in Korea had one in Vietnam. I want to thank the veterans for what they've done for us."

Parsons, of Clarksburg, sout she is also active with several veterans organizations, including the Veterans of Foreign Wars, American Legion, Disabled American Veterans and Military Order of Purple Heart.

Hinerman said she started volunteering with her husband, James, a U.S. Navy veteran of World War II.

She became more involved after her husband

"I don't call it a job. I call it a privilega," said Ilinerman, who volunteers with hospice. "I feel like I'm doing semething for the veterans for all they gave us." Wanda Russell and Liddie

Wanda Russell and Liddie Freeman said they volunteer in the supply unit on the sixth floor of the medical center.

Russell, of Lumberport, was recognized for 10,000 hours of service.

Russell said she started volunteering 21 years ago while her husband, Glenn, was at the medical center for dialysis treatments.

"I just continued after he passed away" in 1994, she said. "Some of them don't have anybody to visit them. It's just a way to help." Freeman said she has

been a volunteer for 17 years.

"I like to help the teterans," Freeman said. "My husband, John, was a Korean War veteran, and they really took good care of him when he was here."

when he was here."
Her husband died in 2000,
Freeman said.

Beth Brown, the medical center's director, said the volunteers are invaluable.

Their efforts complement the services the medical center provides to the 22,000 veterans if sees a year, Brown said.

"Our volunteers really help to support the activities of our VA," she said. "With out them, there are a lot of activities we would not be able to do."

The medical center is always looking for more voluniteers. Brown said.

Bill Chaapel of Philippi is

Chaapel, who served in the U.S. Army during World War II, said volunteering is his way of giving back for the medical treatments he has received at the VA over

the years.

"They've been wonderful," said Chappel, who wheels patients from their bedrooms to other parts of the medical center. "We can't do enough for them."

National Children's Mental Health Awareness Day

When is Awareness Day?

May is Mental Health Awareness Month. Awareness Day is determined by the Substance Abuse and Mental Health Services Administration (SAMSHA) in May, during National Children's Mental Health Awareness Week.

But the date can be flexible! Some groups have held events at other, more convenient times for the organization or community – throughout May, in late April, or on the weekend before or after the official Awareness Day.

What is National Children's Mental Health Awareness Day?

National Children's Mental Health Awareness Day, often shortened to "Awareness Day," is a time to spread the word about the mental health and wellness of children.

For the American Legion Auxiliary, Awareness Day is also an opportunity to pay special attention to military children to ensure their unique challenges and strengths are supported by the community.

The overall goals of Awareness Day are to:

- ***Raise awareness of effective programs for children's mental health needs
- ***Demonstrate how children's mental health initiatives promote positive youth development, recovery, and resilience
- ***Show how children with mental health needs thrive in their communities

Why should we get involved?

Military children are strong and resilient, but they, too, make sacrifices and experience hardships associated with military life. Pre-deployment preparations, prolonged separation and changes in family roles during deployment, and readjustment following deployment place stress and uncertainty on the whole military family, but children often have a harder time than adults understanding the complexities of their circumstances.

During the month of May, Units can use this time to pay special attention to mental health and wellness of military children. By providing materials, hosting activities, and starting discussions about mental wellness in conjunction with other Month of the Military Child projects, and raise awareness about what it means to be a military child today.

Finally, Awareness Day is a great opportunity to spread the word about all the great things the American Legion Auxiliary does for military families.

How can I get involved?

1. There are two main ways to get your unit involved in Awareness Day:

Host your own event, either with your own unit or in collaboration with community partners

2. Participate as a supporter of another organization's established events



CALL FOR NINETY-SECOND ANNUAL DEPARTMENT CONVENTION OF THE AMERICAN LEGION AUXILIARY DEPARTMENT OF WEST VIRGINIA, INC.

The Ninety-Second Department Convention of the American Legion Auxiliary is hereby called and, in conformity with Article IX, Section 1 of the Department Constitution and Bylaws which provides, "That the Department Convention be held annually concurrent with the Convention of The American Legion, Department of West Virginia." The Convention will meet in Huntington, West Virginia on July 10, 11, 12, 2014 at the Pullman Plaza.

PURPOSE

The Convention is called for the purpose of electing officers for the ensuing year, amending the Department Constitution, receiving reports of Department Officers and Chairmen, and for the transaction of such other business as may properly come before it.

REPRESENTATIVES

Representation at the Convention shall be by Units. Each Unit shall be entitled to two delegates, and one additional delegate for each fifty (50) members or major fraction thereof, whose dues have been paid and received by the Department Headquarters one month prior to the Convention for which they were elected. Each delegate shall be entitled to one vote. **No Unit unrepresented shall have a proxy vote**. The elective officers, all Past Department Presidents in good standing shall be delegates-at-large to the Department Convention, with vote to be exercised with their Units, provided said officers are present at the Convention.

ALTERNATES

Each Unit is entitled to one alternate for each delegate. The alternate will have power to vote **ONLY** in the absence of the regular delegate.

CREDENTIALS

<u>Membership cards must be presented by delegates and alternates</u>. <u>Certification</u> of the election of the delegates and alternates **MUST** be mailed to Department Headquarters no less than two weeks prior to the Convention, and **SHALL BE** accompanied by the Convention fee of \$15.00 for each accredited delegates so certified.

EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE MEETING

Pre-Convention Executive Committee Meeting will be held on Thursday, July 10, 2014 at 7:00 P.M. at Pullman Plaza in the Virginia-Maryland Room. The Executive Committee shall be composed of the Department Elective Officers, NEC, the Eight District Presidents, all Past Department Presidents, and Chairmen of all standing committees. All members of standing committees, exclusive of the chairman, may attend the Executive Committee Meeting with the privilege of discussion but without vote. Any member in good standing may attend the Executive Committee Meeting with the privilege of discussion but NO vote.


