# Upward and Onward For Veterans


Good winter morning to all of you Grateful Hearts out there!

Mandatory Funds are Bonding, Department Scholarship, Girls State Project, Veterans 1st Fund, Poppy Order & 10% Poppy Proceeds. Make check payable to Department Treasurer, ALA. DUE into Department July 31st to be a Unit in good standing.

#### **Processing Membership:**

Make sure your membership is into Department Headquarters by the 15th to be counted for Targets.

#### **Membership:**

All applications must have signature of a Post Officer and if they are a Junior member a Birthdate. Unit Membership Chairman should check each application to make sure it is filled out completely including City, Post #, State and zip code. If eligibility is under a Veteran living all information must be filled out before processing into Department Headquar**ters.** If a veteran is living they must hold membership in The American Legion. All unfinished applications will be returned this year. I am receiving too many mistakes on applications. Please check the Birthdates of your Juniors renewing this year. If they will turn 18 years old by December 31, 2014 they are considered a Senior Member. I have had a few Units who has a Debit for this reason.

Remember: if a Woman Veteran joins the Auxiliary under herself you must put on the application at the top "Honor Our Women Veterans" to get the discount from National. Unit Secretary can sign these applications ONLY

DO NOT HOLD DUES!!!



#### Youth Hero-Good Deed Awards



It is often said, "Today's youth are tomorrow's leaders." Every year, we see examples of youth in this country making a positive difference by doing some pretty amazing things. The American Legion Auxiliary created the Youth Hero and Good Deed awards to recognize young girls and boys who are demonstrating a kind of

intentional selflessness. Created in 2002 by the National Children & Youth Committee, these awards are presented annually throughout the year to recognize the heroism and helpfulness of youths under age 18. In the past three years alone, more than 250 Youth Hero and Good Deed awards have been presented to deserving youth.

#### Award Criteria:

Youth Hero Award

Youth Hero Award winners receive a medal and a certificate. On occasion, some Youth Hero Awards are presented at the American Legion Auxiliary national convention.

May be a Junior Auxiliary member or someone eligible for membership, but eligibility is not a criterion for consideration.

Demonstrates a physical act of valor (Heimlich, CPR, first aid, rescuing from fire or water peril)

Serves as an inspirational role model for the organization and the community.

#### Good Deed Award

May be a Junior Auxiliary member or someone eligible for membership, but eligibility is not necessary for consideration.

Donates time and/or money for a worthy cause (such as troop support, Locks of Love, a food drive, etc.)

Is there a youth in your community deserving of this award? I will have copies of the applications at Mid-Winter Conference or you can download the forms from the national website.


