Greetings to all Grateful Hearts!



<u>Mandatory Funds</u> are Bonding, Department Scholarship, Girls State Project, Veterans 1st Fund, Poppy Order & 10% Poppy Proceeds. Make check payable to Department Treasurer, ALA. DUE into Department July 31st to be a Unit in good standing.

Processing Membership:

Make sure your membership is into Department Headquarters by the 15th to be counted for Targets.

Membership:

All applications must have signature of a Post Officer and if they are a Junior member a Birthdate. Unit Membership Chairman should check each application to make sure it is filled out completely including City, Post #, State and zip code. If eligibility is under a Veteran living all information must be filled out before processing into Department Headquarters. If a veteran is living they must hold membership in The American Legion. All unfinished applications will be returned this year.

Please check the Birthdates of your Juniors renewing this year. If they will turn 18 years old by December 31, 2014 they are considered a Senior Member. **Remember:** if a Woman Veteran joins the Auxiliary under herself you must put on the application at the top **"Honor Our Women Veterans"** to get the discount from National. Unit Secretary can sign these applications **ONLY**

MAKE SURE THE POST OFFICER SIGNS OTHER APPLICATIONS.

Hello Ladies!!!



In 1952, Dr. Garland D. Murphy Jr. gave to The American Legion a large contribution that would benefit children. The Legion and Murphy entered into a trust agreement that established the Child Welfare Foundation, approved by the National Executive Committee on Oct. 15, 1953.

Though created by the Legion, the Child Welfare Foundation, Inc., is a separate 501(c)3 corporation.

CWF accepts funding proposals from nonprofit organizations for projects that contribute to the physical, mental, emotional and spiritual welfare of children. Grants are only given to entities that help U.S. children in a large geographic area; they are not awarded for day-to-day operating expenses or special operating expenses.

In 1955, the foundation made its first three grants, totaling \$22,500, to three organizations: the Delinquency Control Institute, the National Association for Retarded Children and the National Society for the Prevention of Blindness. To date, more than \$13 million has been awarded to assist our nation's children.

Thank you to those Units who continue to feed me. I keep getting fatter each month. I know I will be rolly-polly by the time Convention gets here.





PROPOSED AMENDMENT TO STANDING RULES

CURRENT READING OF STANDING RULE #23

- c) Tickets for the Department Fundraiser shall be ordered by Ways and Means Chairman and mailed to Units.

PROPOSED CHANGE TO STANDING RULE #23: Delete Standing Rule #23 and rewrite Standing Rule #23

RATIONALE FOR CHANGE: Several changes have been approved by Department Executive Committee in years since the original Standing Rule #23 was written.

PROPOSED NEW READING OF STANDING RULE # 23

- a) The Department shall hold a Department Fundraiser with 75% earmarked for Welfare Fund and 25% earmarked for General Fund. Tickets for the Department Fundraiser shall be ordered by Ways and Means Chairman and mailed to Units.
- b) The Department shall hold a 50/50 Drawing at the Department Convention with the winner awarded half and the Department receiving the other half.
- c) The Past Department Presidents Club may hold a 50/50 Drawing at the Department Convention with the winner awarded half and the PDP Club receiving the other half.
- d) The Department Juniors may hold a fund-raising project at the annual Department Convention. Proceeds from the project will be submitted to the Department Secretary/Treasurer. The Juniors Chairman will submit expense receipts for payment. An adult, over the age of 18 years, must handle money for Junior members fund raisers. (National)
- All Mid-Winter Conference fund-raising is designated for the Department Welfare Fund. A Silent Auction shall be held.
- f) The Past Department Presidents Club shall hold a 50/50 Drawing at the Mid-Winter Conference with the winner awarded half and the Welfare Fund receiving the other half.
- g) A Poppy Usage Contest may be held at the Mid-Winter with proceeds designated for Welfare Fund.
