Mission Statement

In the spirit of Service Not Self, the mission of the American Legion Auxiliary is to support The American Legion and to honor the sacrifice of those who serve by enhancing the lives of our veterans, military, and their families, both at home and abroad. For God and Country, we advocate for veterans, educate our citizens, mentor youth, and promote patriotism, good citizenship, peace and security.

Mandatory Funds: Bonding, Education, Girls State, Veterans 1st Fund, Poppy Order, and 10% Poppies Proceeds. They are due each year by July 31st to be a Unit in good year. Make checks payable to "*Department Treasurer, ALA*" Units that haven't paid their 2015 Mandatory Funds are: Mannington Unit #40, Lewisburg Unit #69.

Membership Remember to put Junior Birthdates on new applications. All applications must be signed by Post Adj. NOT MEMBER OR SECRETARY). Only exception is if a female veteran is joining the Auxiliary under herself. THEN the Secretary may sign the application. National is waiving the \$9.00 fee again this year for New Female Veterans. You must put "Honor Our Women Veterans" at top of application to get the credit for your Unit.

On February 1st if you send in dues for 2015 only, they will be counted for 2016 year. This comes from National.

Please limit your article to no more than 250 words as you have only one column to use. Spirit is limited to 20 pages (including front and back) to send. At times I have to add different pages (ex. quarterly reports, forms, etc.)

Military Coupon Clipping ---Outdated or Useful?

Is coupon clipping one of your unit's/ member's most valued programs? If so, please read these updates before you send your next package out.

**Many hours are spent clipping, sorting and packaging coupons that are then sent to military commissaries all over in order to help military families. As with all things, technology has made life easier for people to save money at the stores. Because of this, many commissaries now use electronic coupons and no longer accept the paper variety. Unfortunately, some members have reported that their packages have been returned with notes asking that they no longer send coupons to that particular commissary.

**There are still commissaries that accept paper coupons, and, with a little diligence, before sending your packages, you can be assured that they will not be returned. Before you mail your package of coupons, make sure to verify the address to be sure that particular commissary is still collecting the paper coupons.

Parliamentary Points to Ponder

Nominations by a committee

Using a nominating committee to assemble a list of willing and qualified candidates for office can greatly benefit members when the time comes to select their leaders. If the committee does its job well, the membership can enjoy some basic assurance that the candidates nominated have at least expressed interest in the job, have agreed to serve, and are qualified for the offices for which they're nominated. The Nominating Committee should be elected by the membership.

Nominations from the floor

Sometimes called open nominations, this method is probably the most familiar. It's used in the vast majority of situations in which members elect their officers at a meeting. Your group's rules and customs determine when floor nominations are accepted. Sometimes nominations aren't taken until the election is pending, and sometimes they're taken at other times, such as at a meeting before the election meeting. The process of making floor nominations is subject to the following rules:

****Recognition by the chair** is not required to make a nomination. However, calling nominations from your seat is often impractical, so you may want to adopt a more formal nomination process.

**Nominations don't have to be seconded, but it's not out of order for members to second a nomination to signal their endorsement.

**A member shouldn't offer more than one nomination to a position if there are several seats for the same office — such as for nominees to a board or a committee — until all other members have had the opportunity to make nominations.

**If the bylaws don't prohibit it, a person can be nominated for more than one office and can even serve in more than one office if elected.

******Nominations are taken for successive offices in the order they're listed in the bylaws.

Motions to close nominations are usually unnecessary because the nomination process simply continues until no one wishes to make further nominations. When the nominations stop, the chair just declares nominations closed after making sure that no more nominations are forthcoming. Customarily (although it's not required), the chair accomplishes this by calling three times for more nominations.

According to Robert's Rules, a motion to close nominations is out of order as long as any member wishes to make a nomination.
