

Mandatory Funds: Bonding, Education, Girls State, Veterans 1st Fund, Poppy Order, and 10% Poppies Proceeds. They are due each year by July 31st to be a Unit in good year. Make checks payable to "*Department Treasurer, ALA*" Units that haven't paid their 2015 Mandatory Funds are: McMechen Unit #5 (ordered Poppies), Mannington Unit #40, Parkersburg Unit #104 (ordered Poppies), Bluefield Unit #9, Lewisburg Unit #69.

Membership Remember to put Junior Birthdates on new applications. All applications must be signed by Post Adj. NOT MEMBER OR SECRETARY). Only exception is if a female veteran is joining the Auxiliary under herself. THEN the Secretary may sign the application. National is waiving the \$9.00 fee again this year for New Female Veterans. You must put "Honor Our Women Veterans" at top of application to get the credit for your Unit.

Do not send in anymore 2015 transmittals. Put 2015 dues as "Back Dues".

If you send in PUFL's with your membership they will be counted. No new members will be counted until September 1st.

Deadline for Spirit Articles: This year I am extending the deadline for all articles to the 17th. I mail/email the Spirit on the 20th (unless a weekend), then either the Friday before or Monday after. This should give you plenty of time to get your article in. Constitution & Bylaws

Everyone, there is one change that you have to make to your Constitution and By -Laws. This change has to do with eligibility. The revision regarding eligibility adopted by the ALA amended the National Constitution Article III, Section 1 replacing the old wording <u>"granddaughters</u> <u>and great-granddaughters"</u> with "direct descendants of".

The new wording for Eligibility is: Membership in the American Legion Auxiliary shall be limited to the grandmothers, mothers, sisters, wives, and direct and adopted female descendants of the members of The American Legion, and to the grandmothers, mothers, sisters, wives, and direct and adopted female descendants of all men and women who were in the Armed Force of the United States during the following periods; April 6, 1917 to November 11, 1918; December 7, 1941 to December 31, 1946; June 25, 1950 to January 31, 1955; February 28, 1961 to May 7, 1975; August 24, 1982 to July 31, 1984: December 20, 1989 to January 31, 1990; August 2, 1990 to the date of cessation of hostilities as determined by the Government of the United States: all dates inclusive or who being citizens of the United States at the time of their entry therein, served on active duty in the Armed Forces of any of the governments associated the United States during any of said periods, and died in line of duty or after honorable discharged; and to the women who of their own right are eligible for membership in The American Legion.

You do not need to send your whole C&B to be okay, unless you are making other changes. Just send a change from to Department, showing date of change, and signatures of the committee.

Parliamentary Points to Ponder

The subsidiary motion of previous question (to end debate) is one of the easiest subsidiary motions to use because it is not debatable, making it a quick decision. Because adopting it terminates the members' right to speak or hear more information, the previous question requires a two-thirds. But very little can interrupt it, when properly used, the motion can really save you and your group a lot of time because if two-thirds of the voters are ready to stop debate and vote on the pending motion it's probably pointless to keep on with the debate.

STEPS TO ENDING A DEBATE

1. You can't interrupt a speaker who has the floor. You MUST be recognized by the floor. "I move to end debate." or "I call for the question."

- 2. You MUST have a second.
- 3. It is NOT debatable.
- 4. Requires a two-thirds vote.

5. If previous question passes (2/3), then discussion ends and you vote on the motion. If previous question fails, the discussion can continue until nobody has anything to say. If you need .more information, please check Robert's Rules of Order Part I, Section 5, Division 29.

**** Remember that the intent is to have order in your meeting and let everyone express their opinion in a place of goodwill. We are there for our veterans, our community, and our organization. Sometimes personal issues should be left at the door. ****

National Fire Prevention Week is observed in the United States during the week (from Sunday to Saturday) in which October 9th falls. The first Presidential proclamation of Fire Prevention Week was made in 1925 by President Calvin Coolidge. When the President proclaimed the first National Fire Prevention Week on October 4–10, 1925, he noted that in the previous year some 15,000 lives were lost to fire in the United States.

Fire Prevention Week was established to commemorate the Great Chicago Fire, the tragic 1871 conflagration that killed more than 250 people, left 100,000 homeless, destroyed more than 17,400 structures and burned more than 2,000 acres. The fire began on October 8, but continued into and did most of its damage on October 9, 1871. According to popular legend, the fire broke out after a cow - belonging to Mrs. Catherine O'Leary - kicked over a lamp, setting first the barn, then the whole city on fire.

Introduce Fire Prevention Week to children in your community through fun, interactive lessons and activities. The National Fire Protection Association (NFPA) website has tons of information from handouts to videos, as well as information on Sparky the Fire Dog, that will assist you in providing information to the community. 




