Mandatory Funds: Bonding, Education, Girls State, Veterans 1st Fund, Poppy Order, and 10% Poppies Proceeds. They are due each year by July 31st to be a Unit in good year. Make checks payable to "Department Treasurer, ALA" Units that haven't paid their 2015 Mandatory Funds are: McMechen Unit #5 (ordered Poppies), Mannington Unit #40, Parkersburg Unit #104 (ordered Poppies), Bluefield Unit #9, Lewisburg Unit #69.

Membership Remember to put Junior Birthdates on new applications. All applications must be signed by Post Adj. NOT MEMBER OR SECRETARY). Only exception is if a female veteran is joining the Auxiliary under herself. THEN the Secretary may sign the application. National is waiving the \$9.00 fee again this year for New Female Veterans. You must put "Honor Our Women Veterans" at top of application to get the credit for your Unit.

Do not send in anymore 2015 transmittals. Put 2015 dues as "Back Dues".

If you send in PUFL's with your membership they will be counted. No new members will be counted until September 1st.

Deadline for Spirit Articles: This year I am extending the deadline for all articles to the 17th. I mail/email the Spirit on the 20th (unless a weekend), then either the Friday before or Monday after. This should give you plenty of time to get your article in. 

#### **BRANDING for the American Legion Auxiliary**

The American Legion owns the trademark on the American Legion Auxiliary emblem. Our emblem is the main identifier of our organization, and it's one of our most valuable assets at the American Legion Auxiliary. Over the course of our more than nine decades of history, our emblem has remained unchanged and has become well known within our organization – we must preserve and perpetuate this.

#### Here are some rules from the Branding Guide published by the American Legion Auxiliary

\*\*The name is always capitalized and should never by shorten. We need to write or say the American Legion Auxiliary not ALA (especially in public). We are not the "Woman's Auxiliary" or the "Legion Auxiliary" and you are not a member of Post.

\*\*Any use of the name "American Legion Auxiliary" or the emblem shall be subject to the approval of the national secretary, provided, however (a) that any request for such other use shall first be subject to departmental approval before submission to the national secretary, and (b) that any other such use by the departments when approved by the national secretary, shall be confined within the territorial limits of the department..

\*\*No unit, county, district, or department of the American Legion Auxiliary, and no officer or member, thereof, has authority to grant the right to manufacture, reproduce, or deal in items bearing the name and/or emblem of the American Legion Auxiliary.

\*\*Use of the American Legion Auxiliary emblem is controlled by the national organization. All requests for approval to use the emblem must first be sent to the department secretary. The request letter must state who will perform the duplicating (manufacturing), the name of the product, its intended use and the exact amount being ordered. Additional quantities require new authority. The department secretary indicates her approval and affixes her signature before forwarding the request to the national secretary.

\*\*The letter authorizing use of the emblem by the national secretary must be issued to the manufacturer and will be sent directly to the manufacturer. Copies of the authorization letter will be sent to the department secretary and the person making the request if that information is

\*\*Units are confined to using the emblem or reproduction of the emblem on stationary, unit publications, notices, posters, place cards, or matters of similar character used in the ordinary routine and conduct of legitimate unit business. Departments are similarly limited. Any other use of the name "American Legion Auxiliary" or the emblem shall be subject to the approval of the national organization.

We need to get our brand out to the public and make the American Legion Auxiliary an organization so that others will want to join us and work with us.

REMEMBER TO BE BRANDED at the Midwinter Conference at Lakeview in February. On Saturday, my challenge is to wear red/white/blue with the American Legion Auxiliary emblem. Those not wearing red/white/blue and emblem will be fined \$1 for the President's Project. You will be fined only by me. What your friends do it up to them.

#### **Americanism**

November is one of the most important months. We celebrate 96 years of Faith, Family and Freedom with the birthdate of The American Legion November 10 1919. Happy Birthday!! If not for our veterans, we would not have this.

On the 11th day of the 11th month at the 11th hour we will celebrate with solemn pride those that gave their lives and gratitude for the victory of others returning from the "Great War" WWI, November 11, 1918. An Act (53 Stat. 351; 5 U. S. Code, Sec. 87a) approved May 13, 1938 made the 11th of November in each year a legal holiday to be dedicated to the cause of world peace and known as "Armistice Day", but in 1954 after WWII with the greatest mobilization of forces and aggression in Korea the 83rd Congress removed the word Armistice and inserted the word Veteran.

November is a month near and dear to my heart, it's Go Purple with a Purpose for Alzheimer's Diseases Awareness and Caregivers Month. President Reagan designated this in 1983. November 15 1777 The Articles of Confederation were adopted by the Continental Congress. November 19 1863 President Abraham Lincoln delivered the Gettysburg address in less than two minutes. Many in attendance were unimpressed at the time but Lincoln's words came to symbolize the very definition of democracy itself. November 22 1963 at 12:30 pm shots rang out in Dallas, striking our beloved President John F Kennedy, the 35th President of the United States. I think most of us will remember where we were and what we were doing at that time in history. Thanksgiving Day is a National Holiday on the fourth day of November and has been since 1789 after a proclamation by President George Washington as a day of prayer and public thanksgiving in gratitude for successful establishment of a new American Republic. Each year a turkey gets a "Presidential pardon", this started and has been carried on since George H.W. Bush, Vice President under Ronald Reagan in 1989 and continues, with the turkey being sent to various zoos and farms. We have so much to be thankful for in these United States.

Please try to get into your local schools and help the teachers with all this information. Veterans in VA hospitals, local nursing homes might need a visit or a turkey picture colored by the children. Perhaps you can offer a Veterans Day dinner and a Thanksgiving Day dinner for the less unfortunate in your community. Just remember to thank a Veteran for all they have given us.

Please remember you must change the wording under eligibility. The revision regarding eligibility adopted by the American Legion Auxiliary amended the National Constitution Article III Section 1 to read:

Membership in the American Legion Auxiliary shall be limited to the grandmothers, mothers, sisters, wives, and direct and adopted female descendants of the members of The American Legion, and to the grandmothers, mothers, sisters, wives, and direct and adopted female descendants of all men and women who were in the Armed Force of the United States during the following periods; April 6, 1917 to November 11, 1918; December 7, 1941 to December 31, 1946; June 25, 1950 to January 31, 1955; February 28, 1961 to May 7, 1975; August 24, 1982 to July 31, 1984; December 20, 1989 to January 31, 1990; August 2, 1990 to the date of cessation of hostilities as determined by the Government of the United States; all dates inclusive or who being citizens of the United States at the time of their entry therein, served on active duty in the Armed Forces of any of the governments associated the United States during any of said periods, and died in line of duty or after honorable discharged; and to the women who of their own right are eligible for membership in The American Legion.

Remember you don't have to send to me for approval, just amend your Constitution and send into Department Headquarters so Department Secretary Paulette can attach it to your Unit's constitution.

### Parliamentary Points to Ponder



The most important principle that all presiding offic-

ers must remember is that they represent all the members, not just a select few and not just those with whom they agree. The duty of the presiding officer is to keep control of the meeting, but more that it is to see that during debate, all the facts pros and cons - come out in the discussion so that the assembly can make an informed decision. No member should feel that the presiding officer takes sides, but rather that the officer allows the assembly, through the democratic process, to arrive at the will of the majority. To ensure fairness and impartiality, the president adheres to the following rules: \*\* In a business meeting, the president

\*\* In a business meeting, the president CANNOT make motions or enter into debate.

\*\*The president can enter into debate only if he or she leaves the chair and lets the vice president or another officer preside; that is, if the president gives up his or her function of presiding over the meeting. If the presiding officer steps down and enters debate, he or she must stay out of the chair (not return to presiding) until the motion has been disposed of either temporarily or finally.

\*\*The president also steps down from the chair and lets the vice president or another officer preside when a motion has direct personal or monetary interest or when he or she is censured. However, the presiding officer can stay in the chair during nominations and elections when he or she is a candidate for office or is being considered in a motion with others – for example, if there is a motion to send delegates to a convention and the president is nominated as one of the candidates.

\*\*The president DOES NOT vote except in three situations:

if the president's vote would break a tie vote

if the president's vote would create a tie vote

if the president voted in balloted voting, he or she cannot not break a tie (this would give the president two (2) votes and is not allowed)

#### **Blue Star Banner**

It's an American tradition to display a Blue Star Service Banner in the window of a home when a loved one is proudly serving in the U.S. Armed Forces. As Americans support troops deployed overseas, the Blue Star Service Banner is a reminder that war touches every neighborhood.

The Blue Star Service Banner was designed and patented in 1917 by World War I Army Capt. Robert L. Queisser of the 5th Ohio Infantry. Queisser's two sons served on the front line. His banner quickly became the unofficial symbol for parents with a child in active military service. Blue Star Mothers and Gold Star Mothers organizations were established during World War I and remain active today.

During World War II, the Department of War issued specifications on manufacture of the flag, as well as guidelines indicating when the service flag could be flown and by whom. Restrictions were also passed on who can wear the service lapel. The Department of Defense authorized the service flag and service lapel on Dec. 1, 1967. The Blue Star Service Banner is an 8.5-by-14-inch white field with one or more blue stars sewn onto a red banner. The size varies but should be in proportion to the U.S. flag. Today, families display these banners when they have a loved one serving in the U.S. Armed Forces. The blue star represents one family member serving, and a banner can have up to five stars. If the individual is killed or dies, a smaller golden star is placed over it. Gold stars are placed above the blue stars or to the top right of the flag, in the event a flag represents multiple service members.

Blue Star Service Banners were widely used during both world wars, but were not embraced during the Korean or Vietnam wars with the same enthusiasm. The American Legion rekindled that spirit of pride in our military men and women following the Sept. 11, 2001, terrorist attacks by providing banners to military families across the nation.

The Blue Star Banner has seen a resurgence of late and I would like to encourage each unit to honor the Blue Star Mothers in your community. You can hold as recognition ceremony or simply honor them with the presentation of a Blue Star Banner, decal, button or lapel pin. I distributed Blue Star Banners on card stock at the Leadership Conference and these can be copied and put in windows. Whatever you choose to do, remember these mothers are making a tremendous sacrifice for our country and we need to honor that sacrifice.

I would like for all units to sponsor a Poppy Poster contest in your local schools. The contest will have seven classes

Class 1: Grades 2 and 3

Class 2: Grades 4 and 5

Class 3: Grades 6 and 7

Class 4: Grades 8 and 9

Class 5: Grades 10 and 11

Class 6: Grade 12

Class 7: Students with special needs defined as: those in special educations classes; A student recommended for special education but who has not been admitted due to a waiting list or due to lack of facilities, identification contingent upon discretion of school officials.

#### Poster Requirements:

- 1. Each poster shall have a fitting slogan not to exceed 10 words. Words "a", "and", "an", "the", are not to be counted as words. The words "buddy" and "buy" cannot be used.
- 2. The words "American Legion Auxiliary" must be used in the design of the poster and will not be counted in the 10-word count.
  - 3. Each poster must include a picture of the red Flanders Field poppy.
- 4. The closing date of the unit contest is January 1, 2016. The poster shall be on 11 x 14 poster board, drawing paper will not be accepted.
- 5. The United States flag may be used as long as there are no infractions of the flag code.
- 6. Media used shall be watercolors, crayons, powder or oil paint, handmade paper cutouts, ink or textures, acrylics, pencils, and markers.
- 7. Written in ink on the back of the poster shall be the class in which the entry is submitted, the name, address, age, and grade of the contestant and the name of the department.
- 8. Submissions become property of the American Legion Auxiliary and the contestant grant legal rights to have their poster published for commercial use.
  - 9. The poster must be the work of only one individual.
- 10. The label "In Memoriam" from the veteran made poppy may not be used
- 11. When the Holy Cross is used, the Star of David also shall be used.

Please bring these posters to Midwinter in February to be judged so the winners can be sent on to National.


