**Some leaders have a fear of change and therefore, refuse to accept changes that will better our organization. We all have a fear of the unknown, but as a group we can face it together and gain strength from each other.

"Negativity can thwart what could be a great idea." How do we accept new ideas? Are we willing to work as a "team" on new programs or projects?

Do we welcome all ages? Do we accept our "seasoned" members, our new members, our junior members, and our unique members? We all have worth and have good ideas that need to be shared.

KDH2 buttons may be ordered through a commercial vendor or made yourself. Remember these kids sometimes make the biggest Sacrifices.
