For God and Country, we advocate for veterans, educate our citizens, mentor our youth, and promote patriotism, good citizenship, peace and security.

Mandatory Funds: are Bonding (\$5.00), Education (Scholarship), Girls State Project, Veterans' 1st Fund, (any amount your unit can afford) and Poppy Order, 10% of Poppy Proceeds.

They are due 30 days before convention to be eligible for unit voting.

If you would like to receive the Spirit by email, please let me know so I can put you on the email listing. If you want Mail Call by email, I will need that also. You can have both, but if you want just one or other, let me know.

Past Presidents' luncheon will be in the June Spirit due to the renovation of the old Pullman Plaza.

2019 Convention Committees will be listed in June Spirit.

Credentials will be sent out **May 31st** to all units. Make sure your mandatory funds are paid 30 days before convention (**June 12th**) Credentials will be **emailed** to Units with email contacts, or **mailed** to units with no email. If you don't receive your credentials by email 1st of June, let me know. Please don't wait until the last minute to let me know.

Department President Rhonda and I are working on units getting your poppies. Please be patient and I will email you when we have more information.

Membership: National is honoring our "new" female veterans again this year. Please remember to put "Honor Our Female Veterans" at top of application. If a member is rejoining, I don't need an application sent in. You may want one for your records to make sure she is still eligible. If you do send one in, write either "rejoin" or her ID number on the application so she won't be listed as a new member in the system.

**Please don't send me the DD214.** They are for the unit files only. Post Officer signature is all I need on application to verify the eligibility.

All applications sent to the Department Office needs to be the **original**. Copies are for you to keep.


Speaking of convention.....got your room yet????

### National Executive Committeewoman

To clarify the proposed changes presented last month to National's Standing Rules for there Standing Committees; they are wanting to reduce the number of committee members, because first not always enough to fill each spot, and second there is not always enough work to spread out to each member to do.

There are a few issues in the works between The American Legion and the American Legion Auxiliary at the National level. First, the Legion was not happy with the Auxiliary pulling out of the DC Conference. So the Auxiliary is rethinking that issue and may call the Department Legislative Chairman in for the DC Conference next year. Second, the Legion doesn't know who to talk to, so during this years DC Conference Peggy Thomas, Virginia Hobbs, and Linda Boone were to meet with Legion leaders and set up quarterly meetings of staff and directors from both sides.

There was a bylaw change made to the National level bylaws, to add an executive committee of 5, to the NECs, that was approved in a NEC meeting last year, that will resurface. Chris Dickey, the parliamentarian was contacted and after she reviewed all the governing documents, it was decided the vote had to go to the membership body. So it will most likely come to the floor during National Convention. Chris also strongly recommended that governing documents at the National level be reworked. Reason being, it seems one document refers to another but then that document doesn't address the issue, and the back and fourth between the bylaws and standing rules could get us in trouble.

They talked a little about the new Goodwill Ambassador Award, which was due into Departments March 1. Units fill out the form and nominate to departments. Department selects one and sends to their division. Each division sends one to national. These 5 ladies will be awarded at National Convention.

A few highlights under committee reports, AEF has given out twice what has come in this year, It was suggested to use veterans to judge poppy posters, new junior handbook online but emblem sales is still outdated, have a units meals on wheels for veterans who can't get out.

There were a few things National is stressing and have been for a few years now. One is National would like to see all Department having NEC's serving more than a 1 year term. The reason behind this is, they feel the first year a new NEC is just learning and by the time the year is over, they are then replaced with a different person serving as NEC and now that person is going to spend their year is the learning phase. The other I am going to touch on now since units will be holding elections soon, that is to not have the same person serving as the secretary and the treasurer. The reason behind this is IF someone is going to do wrong, it is easier for them to do so holding both positions. There is no checks and balances. I am not saying someone will but National has seen problems and even the CPA they had speak said this is one of the biggest "no no's".

Next month I will have more from the CPA that spoke and does National's books.

## CALL FOR NINETY-SEVENTH ANNUAL DEPARTMENT CONVENTION OF THE AMERICAN LEGION AUXILIARY DEPARTMENT OF WEST VIRGINIA, INC.

The Ninety-Sixth Department Convention of the American Legion Auxiliary is hereby called in conformity with Article IX, Section 1 of the Department Constitution and Bylaws which provides, "That the Department Convention be held annually concurrent with the Convention of The American Legion, Department of West Virginia." The Convention will meet in Huntington, West Virginia on July 11, 12, 13, 2019 at the Doubletree by Hilton.

#### **PURPOSE**

The Convention is called for the purpose of electing officers for the ensuing year, amending the Department Constitution, receiving reports of Department Officers and Chairmen, and for the transaction of such other business as may properly come before it.

#### **REPRESENTATIVES**

Representation at the Convention shall be by Units. Each Unit shall be entitled to two delegates, and one additional delegate for each fifty (50) members or major fraction thereof, whose dues have been paid and received by the Department Headquarters one month prior to the Convention for which they were elected. Each delegate shall be entitled to one vote. **No Unit unrepresented shall have a proxy vote.** The elective officers, all Past Department Presidents, in good standing shall be delegates-at-large to the Department Convention, with vote to be exercised with their Units, provided said officers are present at the Convention.

#### **ALTERNATES**

Each Unit is entitled to one alternate for each delegate. The alternate will have power to vote **ONLY** in the absence of the regular Delegate.

#### **CREDENTIALS**

Membership cards must be presented by delegates and alternates. Certification of the election of the delegates and alternates MUST be mailed to Department Headquarters no less than two weeks prior to Convention, and SHALL BE accompanied by the Convention fee of \$20.00 for each accredited delegates so certified.

#### EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE MEETING

Pre-Convention Executive Committee Meeting will be held on Thursday July 11, 2019 at 7:00 pm at the Doubletree by Hilton in the Virginia-Maryland Room. The Executive Committee shall be composed of the Department Elective Officers, NEC, the Eight District Presidents, all Past Department Presidents, and Chairmen of all standing committees. All members of standing committees, exclusive of the chairman, may attend the Executive Committee Meeting with the privilege of discussion but without vote. Any member in good standing may attend the Executive Committee Meeting with the privilege of discussion but NO vote.

#### Proposal for a Change in the Department Bylaws

Article II: Duties of Officers: Section 12 reads:

The Department Past President shall be the National Executive Committeewoman for the year immediately following her term as Department President and the Department President shall be the Alternate National Executive Committeewoman. In case of death or the National Executive Committeewoman fails to fulfill her obligations she shall resign and the immediate Past Department President will serve as the National Executive Committeewoman for the remainder of her year. In case the immediate Past Department President isn't able to serve, then it would fall on the next immediate Past Department President.

Proposal for Change: The National Executive Committeewoman shall be elected for a two (2) year term at Department Convention. She shall be a Past Department President and be endorsed by her unit. Nominations may be taken from the floor. After her term, she will step down for two (2) years. Then she may run again. This would start with the 2020-2021 fiscal year.

Rational: National has been wanting the National Executive Committeewoman to have at least a two (2) year term, as one (1) year doesn't allow adequate time for most NEC members to become familiar with their fiduciary, policy, and strategic responsibilities to the organization, or to become fully knowledgeable of ongoing programs and issues.

New Reading: The National Executive Committeewoman shall be elected for a two (2) year term at Department Convention. She shall be a Past Department President and be endorsed by her unit.

Nominations may be taken from the floor. After her term, she will step down for two (2) years. Then she may run again. The current Department President shall be the Alternate National Executive Committeewoman. In case of death or the National Executive Committeewoman fails to fulfill her obligations she shall resign and the immediate Past Department President will serve as the National Executive Committeewoman for the remainder of her term. In case the immediate Past Department Presidents isn't able to serve then it would fall on the next immediate Past Department President.
