#### Constitution & Bylaws

What Is a Quorum, and Why Is It Important?

Excerpted from an article by Laura "Susie" Clyde Member, former National Constitution & Bylaws Committee

In order to conduct business at a meeting, it requires a quorum – the minimum number of members who must be present at the meeting before business can be legally transacted. The requirement of a quorum is a protection against unrepresentative action in the name of the association by an unduly small number of people. Robert's Rules of Order state that if the bylaws do not specify what the quorum shall be, it is a majority of the members of the association.

In some organizations, however, it is often not possible to obtain the attendance of a majority of the membership at a meeting. Most associations should therefore have a provision in their bylaws for a relatively small quorum. An actual number can be listed, or a percentage of the membership can be specified. No single number or percentage will be suitable for all associations. A quorum should be a small enough number to permit the business of the association to proceed, but large enough to prevent a small minority from abusing the right of the majority of the members by passing motions that do not represent the thinking of the majority.

Quorum Q&A – Test Your Knowledge!

Q: Before calling a meeting to order, the chair needs to be sure a quorum is present. A: True – The chair should inspect attendance and determine that a quorum is present. If a quorum cannot be obtained, the chair should call the meeting to order, announce the absence of a quorum and entertain a motion to adjourn, fix the time in which to adjourn, recess and/or take measures to obtain a quorum.

Q: If a quorum is present at the start of the meeting, but due to members leaving and the quorum falls below the minimum, it is still legal to conduct business.

A: False – If a meeting has a quorum to begin with, but members leave the meeting, the continued presence of a quorum is presumed unless the chair or a member notices that a quorum is no longer present. If the chair notices the absence of a quorum, it is her duty to declare the fact, at least before taking any vote or stating the question on any new motion. Any member noticing the apparent absence of a quorum can raise a point of order to that effect at any time so long as she does not interrupt a person who is speaking. A member must question the presence of a quorum at the time a vote on a motion is to be taken. A member may not at some later time question the validity of an action on the grounds that quorum was not present when the vote was taken.

Q: If a meeting is held, and business is transacted but a quorum was not present, the business that occurred is valid.

A: False – In the absence of a quorum, any business transacted is null and void. Q: In any meeting of delegates, the quorum is a majority of the number of delegates who have been registered as attending, unless the organization's bylaws provide otherwise.

A: True - Even if some have departed, the quorum is the majority of those registered.


