Our recent NEC Virtual Meeting was well attended with 161 Members present. We discussed many things, went through Committee Reports, and passed a few items.

The Strategic Committee Group suggested Goals and Strategies to include Inclusion and Diversity into our Programs. It was approved to set up a Small Committee to work towards this suggestion. It is named "The Diversity and Inclusion Committee". It purpose is to come up with a plan and procedure to ensure Inclusion and Diversity in our programs. The Committee will run only throughout the 2020-2021 Year. <u>**Any</u> <u>member is encouraged to apply for this</u> <u>committee**.</u> I will forward application information once it is submitted to me.

Trish Ward, Constitution & By-Laws Committee Chairman, and Committee Members were asked to review the "Code of Ethical Conduct" and how it can used for Department and Unit Officers and Members. The result is "It cannot be implemented for Department and Unit Officers and Members^{*}. Recommendation was given and approved for the following: To Set up a Small Committee and the purpose is to come up with a Training Departments and Units can use. This training will show Departments and Units how to create a "Code of Ethical Conduct" geared to each Level. (Paperwork, Wording, etc.) ******Any Member is encouraged to apply for this committee** This committee will dissolve at the completion of it's goal or at the end of the 2020-2021 Year whichever one comes first. I will forward application information once it is submitted to me.

Resolution for Constitution & By-Laws was given and approved. This came about due to members asking for a better understand of them.
