I want to wish everyone a Happy Thanksgiving, make sure our veterans have food on the table if at all possible.



The American Legion is urging Congress to unanimously pass the Bubby Check Bill. This will require the VA to establish a "Buddy Check Week," as well as provide educational opportunities, materials and references for veterans to learn how to conduct personal wellness checks. The bill also compels VA to expand resources for the Veterans Crisis Line to handle any potential increased volume during the designated week.

The holidays can be a difficult time and adding to the problems some are already facing along with the pandemic and isolation, so the Legion is requesting all hands on deck by contacting your legislators about S. 4657 & H.R. 289 bills. Help take this program to the next level and stem the tide of suicide among our nation's veterans.

With military suicides rising by 20% since the beginning of the COVID-19 pandemic, The American Legion joins bipartisan effort to pass Buddy Check Week.

Mid-year reports are due by the end of the year. Why not go ahead and get them in now before all the holiday madness and get them out of the way.
