Mandatory Funds: Unit General Fund -Bonding (\$5.00), Education (Scholarship), Girls State Project; Unit Welfare Fund - Veterans' 1st Fund (any amount your unit can afford), Poppy Order, and 10% of Poppy Proceeds.

The Veterans Welfare Fund is the same as the Love Fund, and Veterans 1st Fund. Just had been renamed over the last few years. We don't pay 15 cents a member any more.

The Spirit is free by email or website.

All you have to do is email to let me know. The same for mail call. If you only want or the other, that can be done also.

If you wish Spirit by mail, send \$18.00 for the year (Aug-July)

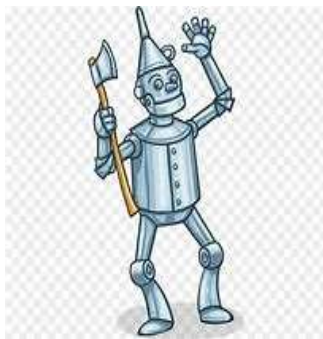
Hello to all,

Hello Fellow Auxiliary Members
I hope everyone is well and safe. Our Department recently held our Annual Workshop which contained an excellent Chaplain Service and a lot of information was given for each of our programs. This prompted me to want to share additional knowledge of the responsibilities of the NEC.

National ALA Bylaws Article IV, Section 2, Authority: "The National Executive Committee shall adopt the annual budget for the National Organization; adopt policies and standing rules, unless otherwise noted in the National Constitution or these Bylaws; review financial statements and accept the national annual audit; ratify committees; confirm the nomination of the National Secretary and the National Treasurer, confirm committee and other national appointments, and confirm the appointment of officials not otherwise provided for in these Bylaws; levy assessments as needed; ratify the cancellation of charters; receive for filing reports from national subsidiary organizations; and other duties and responsibilities that are the normal function of a corporate board of directors.

We are liaisons between National and Department. We assist in getting information out to the Department especially when changes need to be made for our Department to be in line (Compliance) with National.

There were a few Amendments made during National Convention in Arizona this year. However, these Amendments were for National Level Officer and Committees duties. We will not need to make any at our level at this time.

And our title "NEC" will remain the same due to the name change not passing at National Convention.

I hope this information helps you. But if you have any questions/concerns/suggestions, then please contact me.

It was awesome to get together with other auxiliary members I have not seen in so long. However, I did not get information out for the "Flag Alliance". So I want to focus my article on it. The Citizens Flag Alliance is a broad-based, nonpartisan, nonprofit, national organization, which was formed to persuade Congress to pass a constitutional amendment that would return to the American People the right to protect their flag. Can anyone join the Citizens Flag Alliance? It has come together for the single purpose of securing flag protection. We are not concerned about ideologies because the issue belongs to no particular group; it is an American issue. Our membership is diverse and we think that shows the intensity of feelings that Americans have about the issue. Already more than 140 organizations have joined. If you want to join you can do so, or get information by calling the phone 1-317-630-1384. There is also "Let the People Decide" booklet that gives a brief collection of information, observations, and techniques for use in promoting the flag amendment. This booklet can be downloaded on their new website www.citizensflagalliance.com. I encourage each unit to visit this website and hand out this information within your community.

Education

The 2022 College Scholarships are now available on line at alaforveterans.org. They will also be available on our Department website—wvaux.org. On the National website, click on scholarships beneath the ALA logo. There are four National Scholarships—Children of Warriors, Spirit of Youth, Non-Traditional and Junior Member Loyalty. You can download all but the Children of Warriors forms. New this year—students may only apply for the Children of Warriors Scholarship through national's website, alaforveterans.org. The student fills out the necessary information and attaches the required forms and submits. After the submission, the national organization will forward to our Department. The Education Committee will judge these applications. Reasoning for the change are all students are eligible through service members not just those belonging to our organizations. Three \$5000 scholarships are awarded for the Children of Warriors annually in each ALA Division. Central Division consists of IA, IL, IN, KS, MI, MO, OH, WI and WV. Spirit of Youth—total of five \$5000 awarded, one in our division. Non-Traditional—five \$2000, one in our division. Junior Member Loyalty—two \$2500 scholarships awards in our division. If you are close to a VA Hospital, there is a scholarship for the Veterans Affairs Volunteer Service Student Volunteer. See the website: Volunteer.VA.gov for more information.

Please print the three applications from either website and distribute them to your schools. Please advise the school of the online Children of Warriors Scholarship and The American Legion scholarship—accessible through our national website. Deadline for all applications are March 1, 2022. Distribute them early, follow up and adhere to deadlines.

You don't have to live with the veteran to be a caregiver. You are a caregiver if you run errands, cook, cleaning, sit, etc. for a veteran. You CANNOT claim the hours, under Service to Veterans if it is a family member. It must be another veteran not related to you to claim hours. I hope this clear this up.

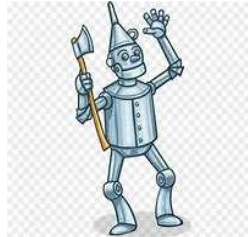

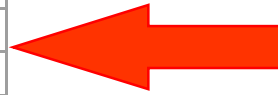
