Mission Statement

In the spirit of service, not Self, the mission of the American Legion Auxiliary is to support The American Legion and honor the sacrifice of those who serve by enhancing the lives of our veterans, military, and their families, both at home and abroad. For God and Country, we advocate for veterans, educate our citizens, mentor our youth, and promote patriotism, good citizenship, peace and security.

<u>Mandatory Funds:</u> (Unit General Fund)- Bonding (\$5.00), Education (Scholarship), & Girls State Project (any amount the unit can afford);

Unit Welfare Fund - Veterans' Welfare Fund (any amount the unit can afford), & 10% of Poppy Proceeds.

Membership: Award—10 Plus 3 in 2023—Recruit 10 New Senior Members and 3 New Junior members. New members must be entered and paid in ALA-MIS by June 1, 2023. Forms must be received at ALA NHQ by June 3, 2023. One entry per recruiter.

There was a dues increase voted on and passed at National Convention in August 2022. This increase will go into effect for the 2024 year. National dues was increased by \$6.00 per diem. This means that units will need to send a total of \$25.00 for National and Department per diem for 2024 year. National will be looking at different ways to cut costs, so another increase will not happen for a couple of years. Units need to increase their dues for the 2024 year.

Notice—I have emailed or mailed credentials to all units for Department Convention. I have also include a copy in the Spirit. Please note due date.

The deadline for 2024 Dues Remittance has passed. A call was made to all units that did not submit the form. IF your unit did not respond to my call, and if the unit's dues needed to be increased. The unit's dues for the 2024 membership year will be \$26.00. The deadline was April 15th. Note—Unit Member of the Year is to be sent to the Leadership Chairman, not Past Presidents Parley.

Website is updated!! New Standing Rules, Award Manual, Scholarship form, Americanism essay, Year-end reports and Poppy order form are all there. Call if you need a printed programs. Remember to download a form it is a 2 step process. Call the office if you if you need help.

New members—when sending in a new application please make sure they are complete. If you are unable to read a new application, how am I suppose to read it. Please clarify illegible writing. The ON-LY time that the unit secretary can sign an application is when a female veteran is joining under herself—No Exceptions! Applications will be returned.

Just a small note; Post and Unit may meet on the same day. They just do not hold their business session together.

Reminder—Your membership is through the Unit not the Post.



Americanism

In observance of Flag Day on June 14th, here are some glossary terms regarding "Old Glory": Band A narrow strip of canvas along the edge of the flag that goes next to the staff. Sometimes called the "heading." Canton The blue field in the upper left corner of the flag. Color In the military service, a national flag carried by unmounted units is called a "color." The expression "the colors" is used generally in referring to the flag. Dip To dip the flag is to lower it at salute. Refers to a flag of an organization, state or city. The U.S. flag is never dipped. Ensign In the Navy, the national flag is usually spoken of as the "ensign." Finial The object on the top of a flag pole – generally an arrow, ball or eagle. Fly The length of the flag. Fringe or Gold Gold braiding placed along the three edges of the flag away from the pole. Grommet The eyelet through which the halyard is fastened to the flag. Half staff To lower the flag some distance (not necessarily halfway down) from the top of the staff, as a sign of mourning. Halvard The rope used to raise the flag. Also called a hoist rope. Hoist The width of the flag. To hoist the flag is to raise it to the top of the staff. Continue-next column

Old Glory

Refers to the U.S. flag. This famous name may have been coined in 1831. Some friends presented Capt. William Driver with a 24-star flag. As the banner opened to the ocean breeze, he exclaimed, "Old Glory!" Peak The highest point to which a flag can be raised. Point of Honor On the U.S. flag, this is the blue field and stars (union). CALL FOR HUNDRED-FIRST ANNUAL DEPARTMENT CONVENTION OF THE AMERICAN LEGION AUXILIARY DEPARTMENT OF WEST VIRGINIA, INC.

The Hundred-FIRST Department Convention of the American Legion Auxiliary is hereby called in conformity with Article IX, Section 1 of the Department Constitution and Bylaws which provides, "That the Department Convention be held annually concurrent with the Convention of The American Legion, Department of West Virginia." The Convention will meet in Huntington, West Virginia on July 6, 7, 8, 2023 at the Doubletree by Hilton.

PURPOSE

The Convention is called for the purpose of electing officers for the ensuing year, amending the Department Constitution, receiving reports of Department Officers and Chairperson, and for the transaction of such other business as may properly come before it.

REPRESENTATIVES
