Mission Statement

In the spirit of service, not Self, the mission of the American Legion Auxiliary is to support The American Legion and honor the sacrifice of those who serve by enhancing the lives of our veterans, military, and their families, both at home and abroad. For God and Country, we advocate for veterans, educate our citizens, mentor our youth, and promote patriotism, good citizenship, peace and security.

<u>Mandatory Funds:</u> (Unit General Fund)- Bonding (\$5.00), Education (Scholarship), & Girls State Project;

Unit Welfare Fund - Veterans' Welfare Fund (any amount your unit can afford), & 10% of Poppy Proceeds.

<u>Membership</u>: Award—10 Plus 3 in 2023—Recruit 10 New Senior Members and 3 New Junior members. New members must be entered and paid in ALA-MIS by June 1, 2023. Forms must be received at ALA NHQ by June 3, 2023. One entry per recruiter.

New Unit Officers forms must be filled out and returned to the office. Forms were due on July 1, 2022. Units will need to use a credit or debt card to process membership to National.

If your Unit is currently using the "Write" program and wish to try the "Full", I will need a written letter or email stating such. You will have until January 1st to decide whether you want to keep "Full" or return to "Write".

New pricing will go into effect January 2023—Unit Full \$20.00; Unit Write \$15.00; Unit View \$10.00;

Junior members who turn 18 yrs. old before January 1st of 2023 are considered Senior members. Please take notice of their status National has marked on your roster. Do Not change status!

As everyone knows, September is a very somber month for this country but one that everyone needs to learn about. September 11, 2001, at 8:46 AM, Flight 11 crashes into the north tower of the World Trade Center, sending everyone into a confused and frightened state. At 9:03 AM, Flight 175 crashes into the south tower. At this point, Americans knew we were no longer safe and under a terrorist attack. 9:05 AM, President George W. Bush was alerted in the middle of speaking to an elementary school class. At 9:37 AM, Flight 77 crashes into the pentagon. And at 10:02 AM, despite the heroic attempts at trying to take back the plane by the passengers onboard Flight 93, it plows into an empty field in Shanksville, Pennsylvania. The plane was most likely heading toward the White House or the US Capitol.

The Patriot Act was enacted on October 26, 2001, following the 9/11 attacks and with the stated goal of tightening U.S. national security, particularly as it related to foreign terrorism. Americans came together and kept them family and friends close and hugged them tight. September 11 is now known as Patriots Day in America each year to represent the people who lost their lives on that fateful day in 2001 but to also show how the US can come together after such a tragic event.

Constitution & Bylaws

Unit Constitution and Bylaws shall not conflict with District, Department or National and needs to comply with the State and IRS laws. Remember these are legal and binding documents that govern your Unit. Yes, we are a volunteer organization, but we are also a non-profit organization and that means we are just like a small business.

Let's talk a little about the business part.

• Units are required to file 990's. If your Unit doesn't IRS can revoke you tax exempt status. Once revoked, IRS can charge a hefty fine to regain your status. Consider adding what month your Unit does this.

• When your Unit does fundraisers, remember all funds collected go through the Unit's bank account. Otherwise, you jeopardize your nonprofit status. Consider adding handling funds to your Rules.

Now, a little on conflict with the higher levels.

A member whose dues are paid up-to-date and who is not subject to suspension or membership revocation under due process shall be considered in good standing and the member shall be entitled to full membership rights, and privileges. So if your Unit has any requirements on members running for an officer position, your Unit is in conflict with National! What would you like to see addressed this year in articles and at workshop?
