Fellow Auxiliary Members, I really enjoyed seeing some of you at Mid-Winter and I hope those that were able to attend found it informative and enjoyable. In an effort to prevent house fires, FE-MA has issued the following recommendations: Keep portable generators outside, away from windows and as far away from your home as possible Keep anything that can burn at least 3 feet away from any heat source, like fireplaces, wood stoves, radiators or space heaters. Plug only 1 heat producing appliance (like a space heater) into an electrical outlet at a time. Install and test carbon monoxide alarms at least once a month. Have a qualified professional clean and inspect your chimney and vents every year. Store cooled ashes in a tightly covered metal container and keep it outside at least 10 feet from your home and any nearby buildings. The second session of 118th Congress started Jan. 3 2024 and will end Jan. 3 2025.

According to the Grassroots Action Center www.votervoice.net/ AmericanLegion/Bills Under Benefits: 16 bills were approved, 1 bill opposed HR1822, 2 in committee, and 1 became a law HR366 **Korean American VALOR** act. **Under Mental Health:** 8 bills were brought forth and supported **Under Healthcare** 25 bills with 24 being supported and 1 sent to committee **Under Employment/Economic Opportunity** -22 bills are supported **Under Education** 11 bills supported with 1 being sent to committee

Under Women Service members - 4 bills were supported

Under National Security all 14 bills supported

1 bill for **Homeland Security** was supported

Under Americanism SJRES34 a joint resolution proposing an amendment to the Constitution to prohibit the physical desecration of the Flag, was referred to the Judiciary Committee.

Under Workforce 6 bills were supported with on being sent to committee. As a whole using the Grassroots Action Center and emailing your representatives has positive effects on their voting! Keep up the great work.

Now we need to be working on: Love Lives on Act to help Goldstar spouses keep their benefits if they marry before 55, Arlington Expansion to preserve military honor,

Pay the Coast Guard, Stand with Veterans' caregivers and the Fight against Predatory Sharks.

It is soooo easy. Click on the Grassroots Tab and send an email to our representatives! You get an email back immediately. You can keep track of that communication and include it in your Annual Report.
