What is the poppy's significance? The poppy is a patriotic symbol of the sacrifices made by our veterans and their families.

What is the meaning of the poppy? The red petals stand for the vast outpouring of blood;

The yellow and black center is the mud and desolation of all battlefields. The green of the stem is symbolic of the forests, meadows and fields where generations of Americans have perished to make this land free.

The stem represents the courage and determination of our fallen warriors. What is the history of the poppy? The American Legion Auxiliary adopted the poppy as its memorial flower in 1921 and in 1924, in conjunction with The American Legion, instituted the national Poppy Program to protect the memorial poppy from becoming commercialized by outside interests. Each year American Legion Auxiliary volunteers distribute millions of poppies in exchange for contributions to
